Paul Ruark Code Enforcement Officer stated the Planning Commission recommended denial.

Mike Chapeau – Green River Builders – Stated he had met with Commissioner Duckett and Maxwell and they suggested changing the plan to make it more palatable and give them time to have a public meeting with citizens about the concerns they have about the apartments.

Atty. Frost closed the public hearing and Ch. Hooper closed the meeting.

c. Z-19-10 – Thai Bui – Rezoning for property located at map/parcel B52/109 located on Felton Circle, Commerce, GA from ARR Agricultural Rural Residential to CAD Consolidated Agricultural District to allow proposed poultry houses.

Ch. Hooper closed the meeting and Atty. Frost opened the public hearing.

Paul Ruark Code Enforcement Officer stated the Planning Commission recommended denial.

Susan Hart, Realtor – Royston – Stated her client's acreage was currently zoned ARR but they were asking for the property to be zoned CAD. She stated the rezoning would allow them to place the six chicken houses further back on the property and possibly build two more chicken houses in the future.

Opposition

Jerry Loftice – Dogwood Drive, Commerce – Stated he lived approximately ½ mile from the potential construction. He stated his property value would decrease because of the odor and was also concerned with the pollutants that could contaminate the water. Mr. Loftice stated the long-term plan for Banks County did not include the area as ARR but rather commercial. He also stated the area was currently residential and was asking the Commissioners to please not disrupt their way of life by approving the request.

Billy Parson – Forsyth – Stated he owned property on McDonald Circle that adjoined the property in question. He stated over the years he had been approached by several people about selling but they have turned them down because he wanted the property kept as family land. He stated his brother in law lives on the property with a wife that has COPD and Stage 4 cancer and that chicken houses would create lots of dust and odor.

Winnie Allen – US 441, Commerce – Stated she was the adjoining property owner on two sides. She stated there are too many houses in the small community to approve CAD. Ms. Allen stated she hoped the seller would consider the residents when flipping property. She also stated the traffic was bad enough because of the schools in the area and the proposed driveway was actually a bus stop. She stated the land had always been pasture and she didn't think chicken houses were a good fit.

Atty. Frost closed the public hearing and Ch. Hooper opened the meeting.

Ch. Hooper asked Commissioner Reece what could be built on the property now the way it was currently zoned. Comm. Reece stated that with a Conditional Use Permit six chicken houses could be built with the property being zoned ARR.

Ch. Hooper wanted to clarify that the only thing that is being voted on tonight was CAD zoning and not building six chicken houses.

Turk stated he was concerned that builders wouldn't be able to get in contact with the inspector. Mr. Chitwood stated Banks County would be assigned the same building inspectors and they would give their contact information to the builders.

The money generated from these tickets would be used for school safety and the contract would be for three years.
